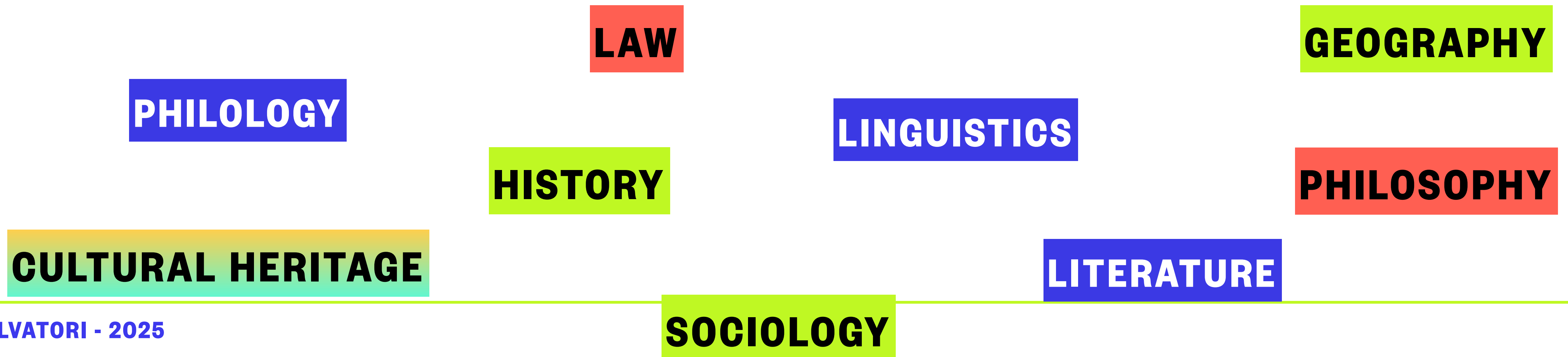

# (When) do we need (disciplinary) borders?

- *Digital Humanities* (DH) —> A long history (since 1949 / 70's) —> heavy influence on all traditional humanities, including History.
- Confusion and overlapping due to digital change: this is positive and advantageous because it **gives dynamism** to the research system BUT
- drawing boundaries is necessary because **we have to understand what are we doing, why and how to do**, even if you want **overcome the boundaries**



# DH Galaxy (Ciotti)

- **core:** general and transdisciplinary, theoretical and methodological issues; infrastructural services in an epistemological, pragmatic and institutional meaning
- **disk:** “strong” digital side of the traditional, often interconnected, disciplines (computational linguistics, digital philology, digital history, computational literary studies, etc.); computational methods, innovative research topics;
- **spiral arms / borders:** when traditional disciplines accept and include the methods and results of computational research; in contact with other disciplinary galaxies such as computer science, library and information sciences, media studies, communication sciences, cognitive sciences

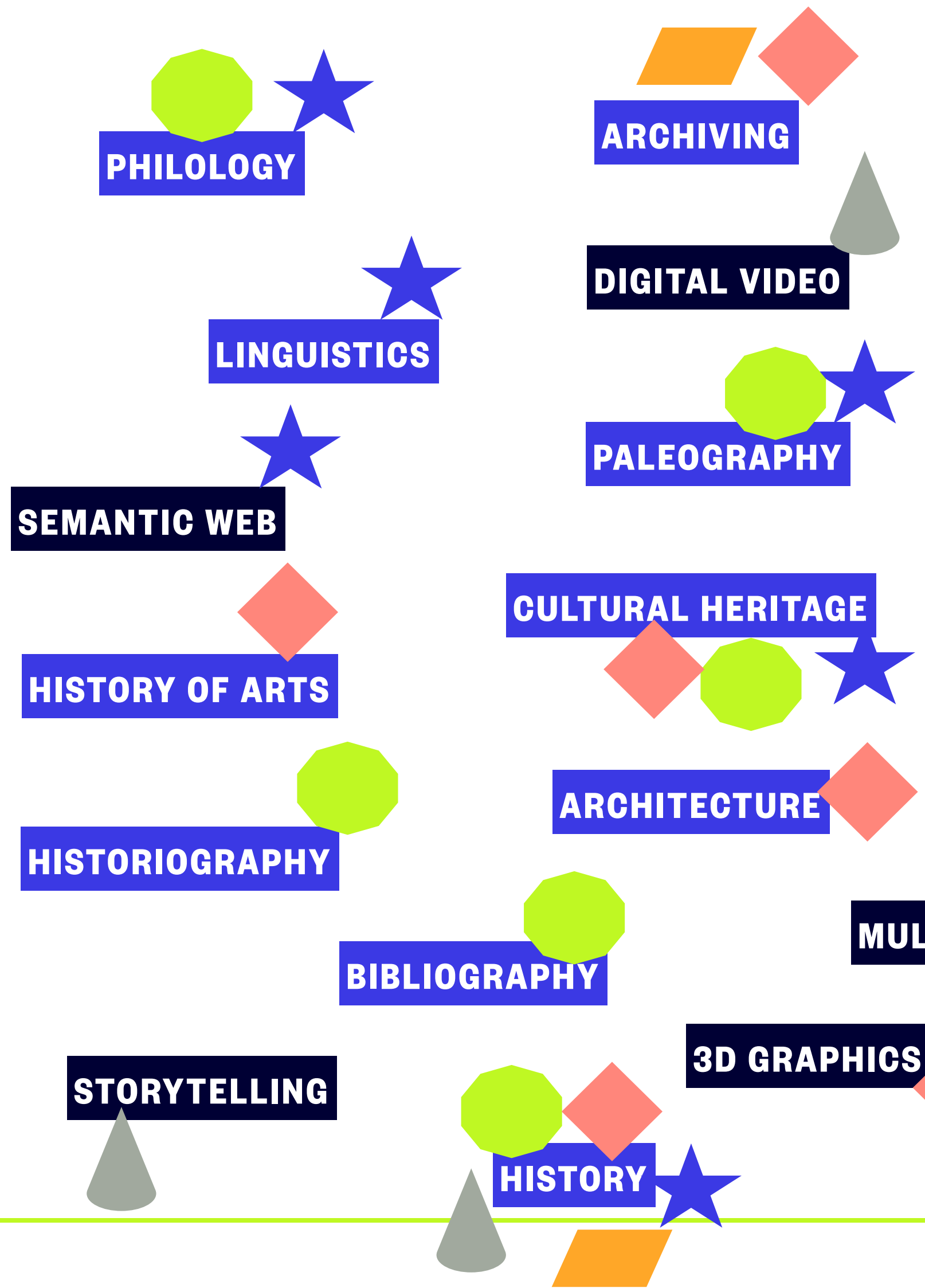

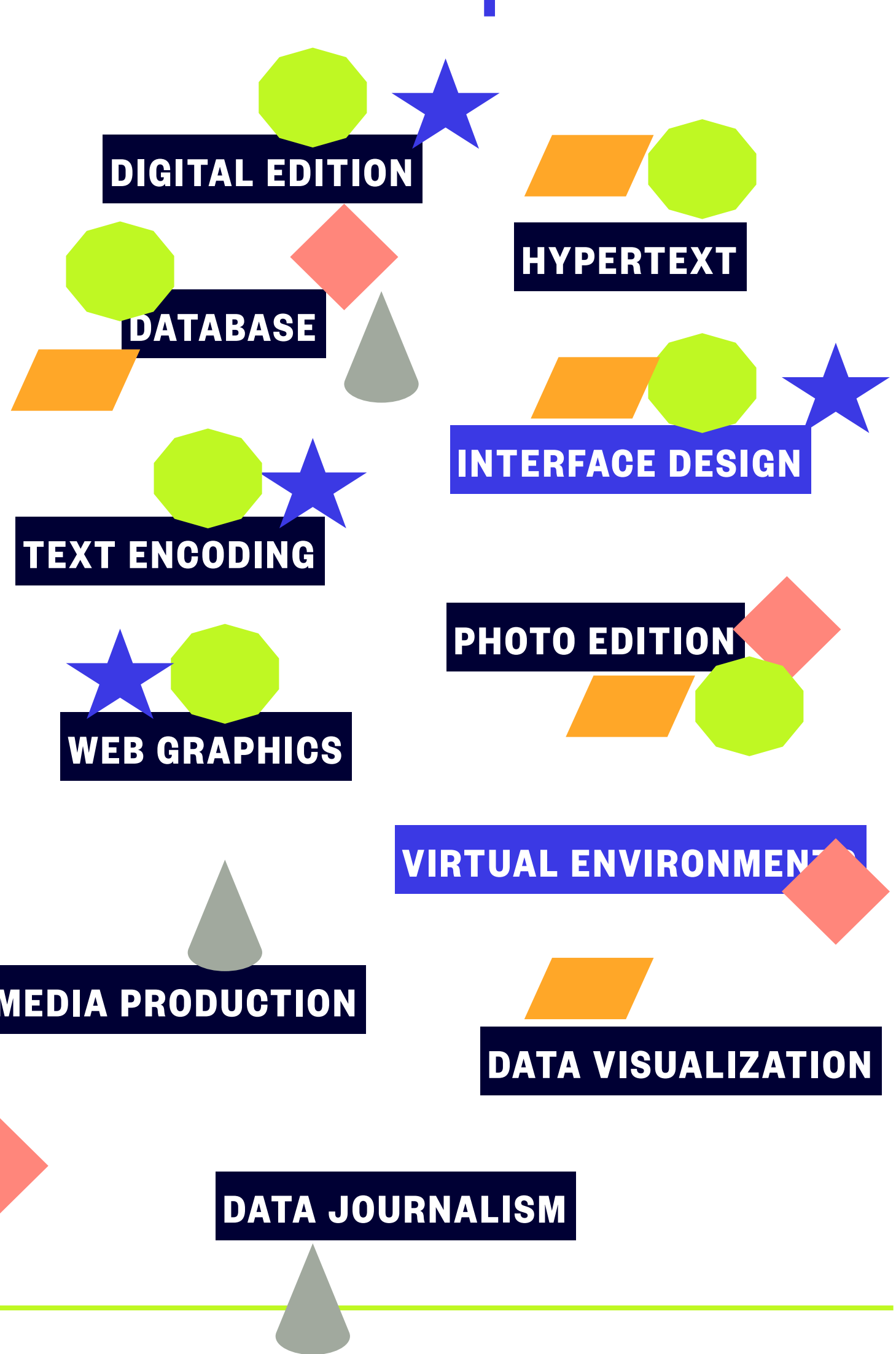

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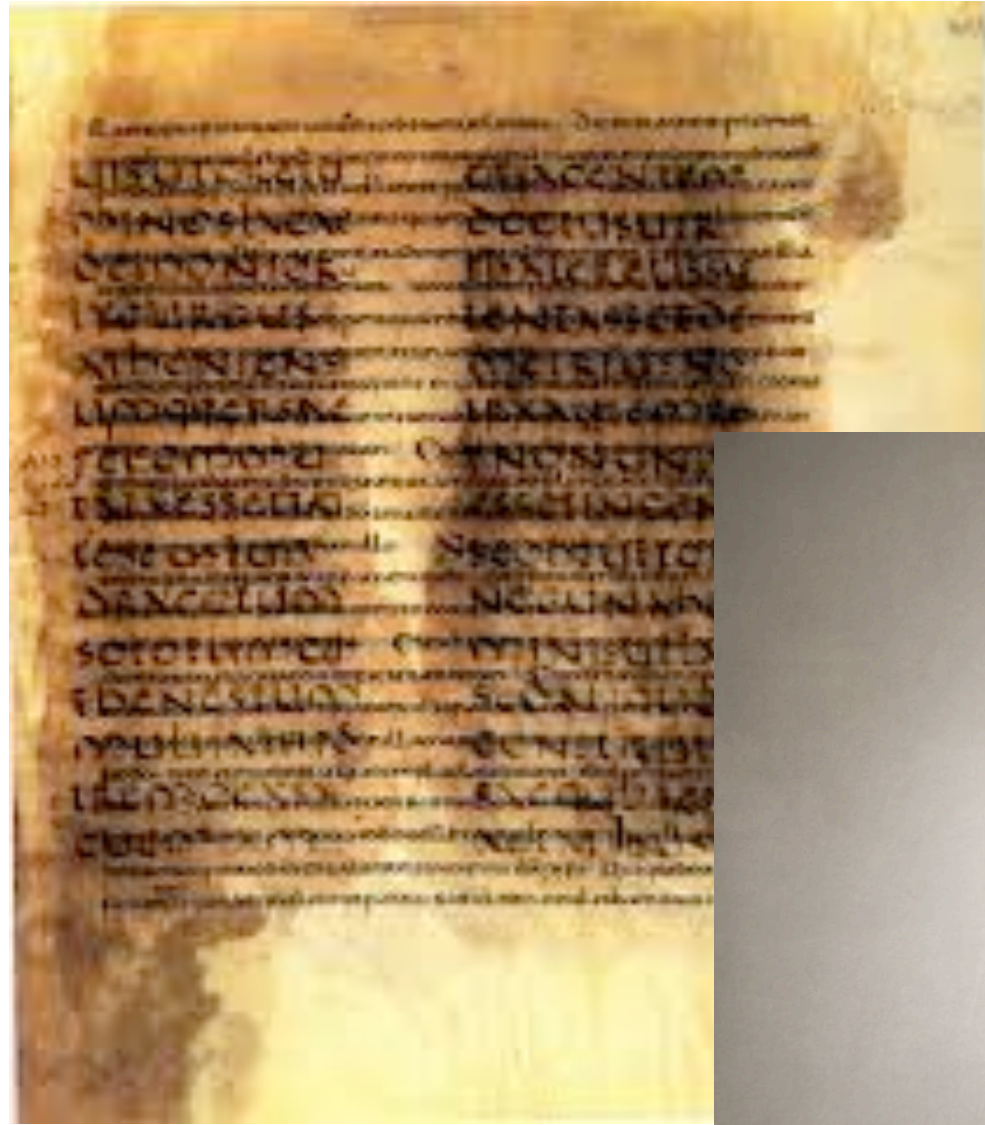
# (When) do we need (disciplinary) borders?

- Let's try to understand what they are (and also what you wish or think to do):
  - Digital Humanities (DH) where **History** is scattered everywhere
  - Digital History (DHy)
  - Public History (PH)
  - Digital Public History (DPHy)

## But first... some fundamental issues



# History is a palimpsest of “stories”



- **Bibliography is not optional** (and so it asks for specific tools)
- ALL historians (and you all) are diving in deep and rooted **NARRATIVES** (es. national, gender oriented, racial, religious, institutional)
- The historical product needs to be **always proved** (notes, references) BUT
- **It is always a tale** (no matter the medium)







# Sources are not a bunch of data

- But the **exegesis**, i.e. the reading/ interpretation of sources, also requires an extraction and categorization (necessarily subjective) of data
- —> digital libraries, digital repositories, transcriptions of sources, corpora **ARE NOT history** but they need it (and vv)

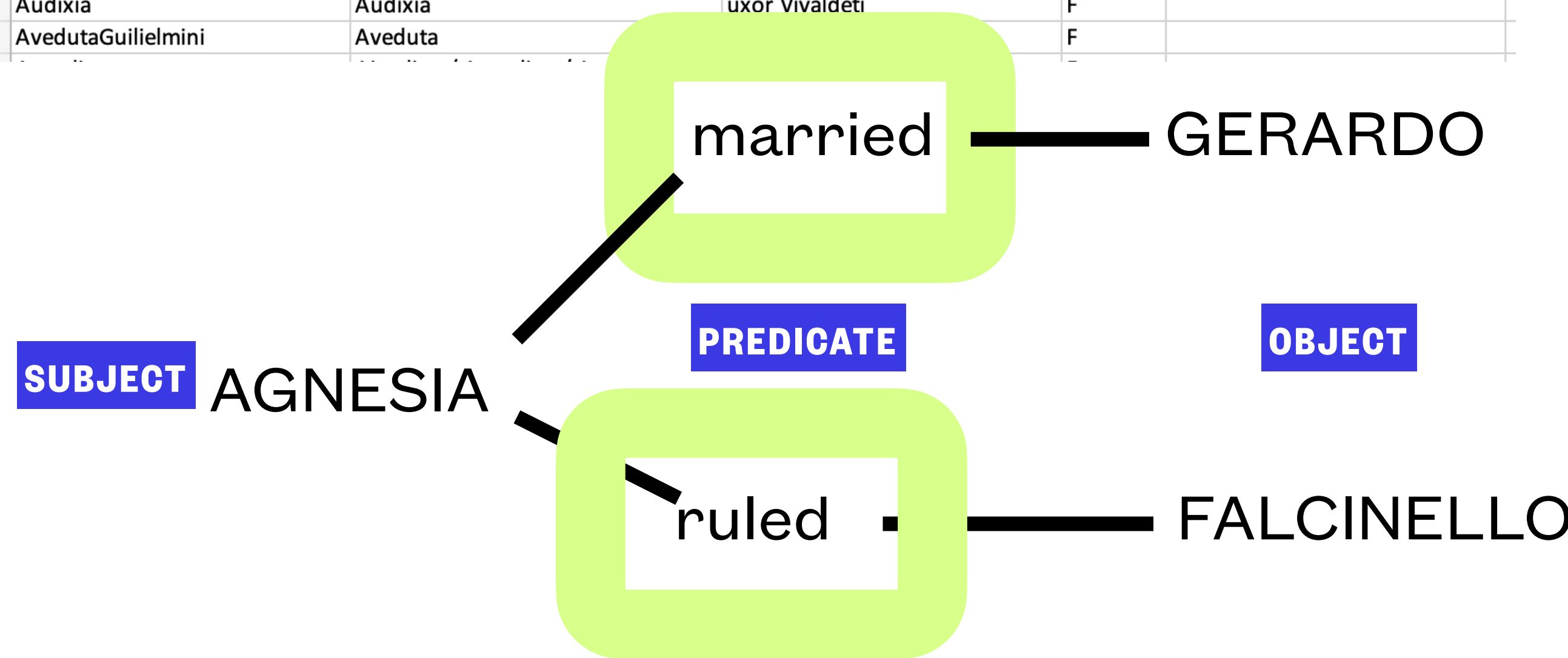

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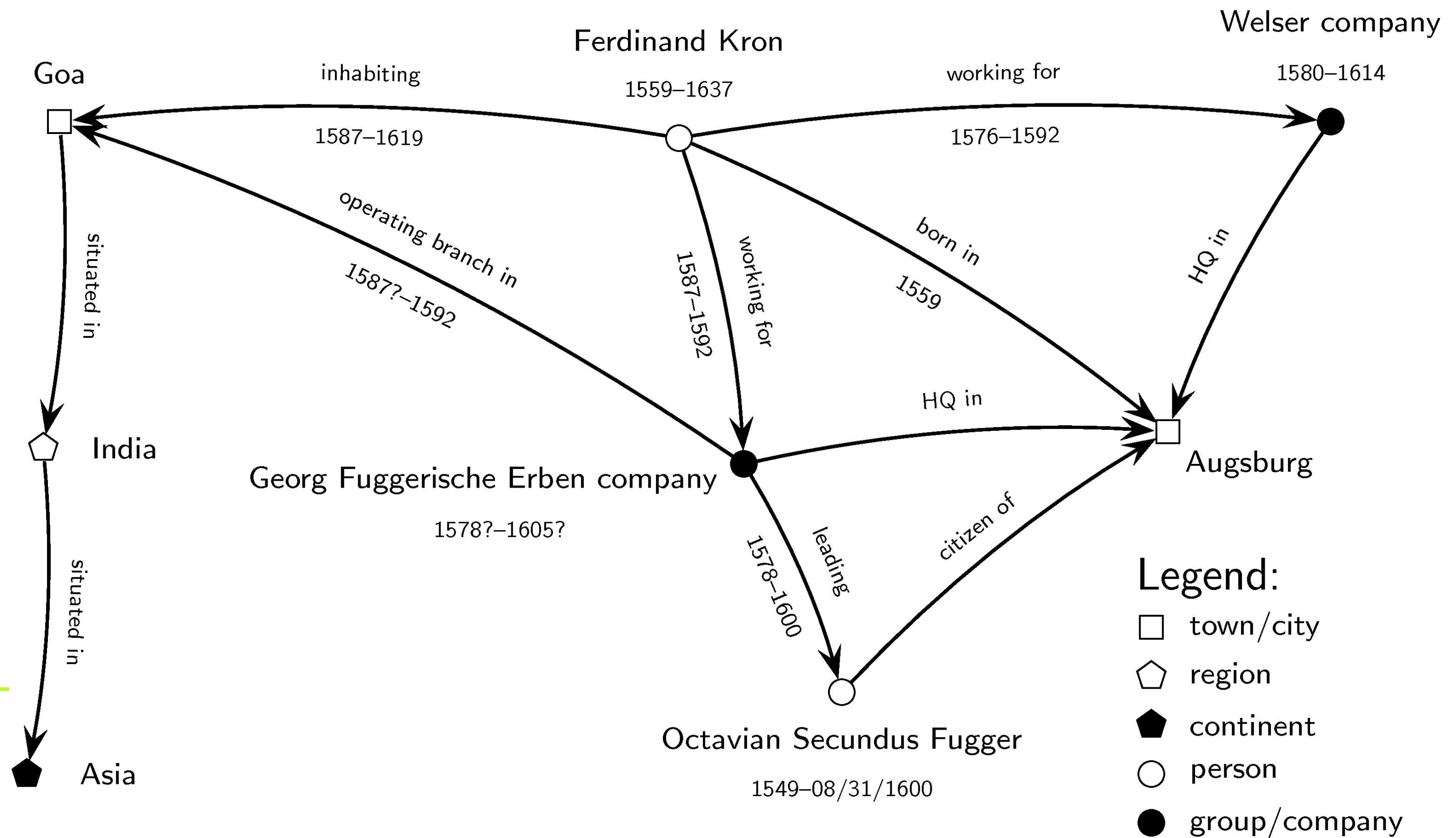
## HOW COULD WE MODEL HISTORICAL DATA?

- The RDF data model is based on the idea of **making statements about resources** (in particular web resources) in expressions of the form **subject–predicate–object, known as triples**. The subject denotes the resource, and the predicate denotes traits or aspects of the resource, and expresses a relationship between the subject and the object.
- BUT **subject–predicate–object** are not unambiguous concepts



# Digital History and Linked Open Data (LOD)

- **Linked Open Data** are structured data that are published online in order to be accessed automatically by computers. By combining different sources huge amount of similar or related structured data are brought together in order to be queried and analyzed.
- This research area is closely related to the **Semantic Web** and its standards stack like RDF\* and OWL.
- But does it exist the “right” model for historical data?

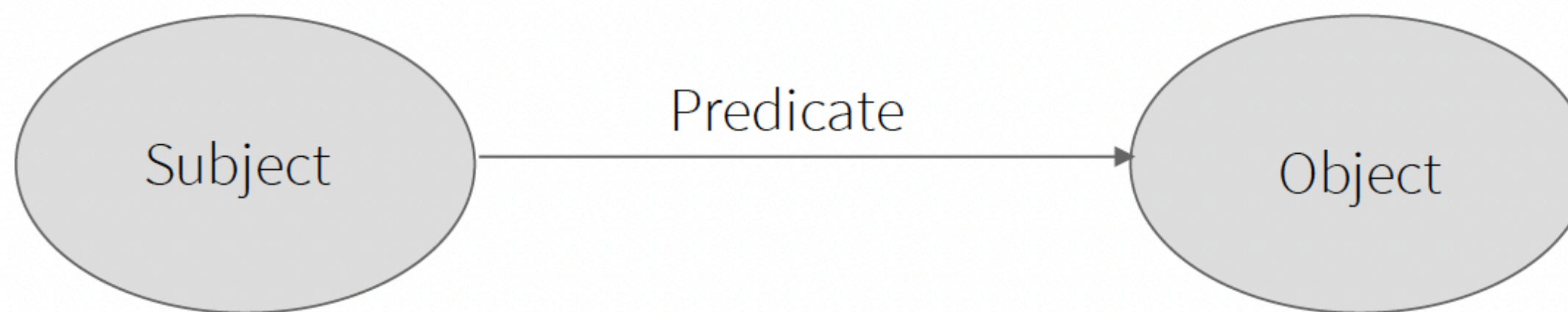

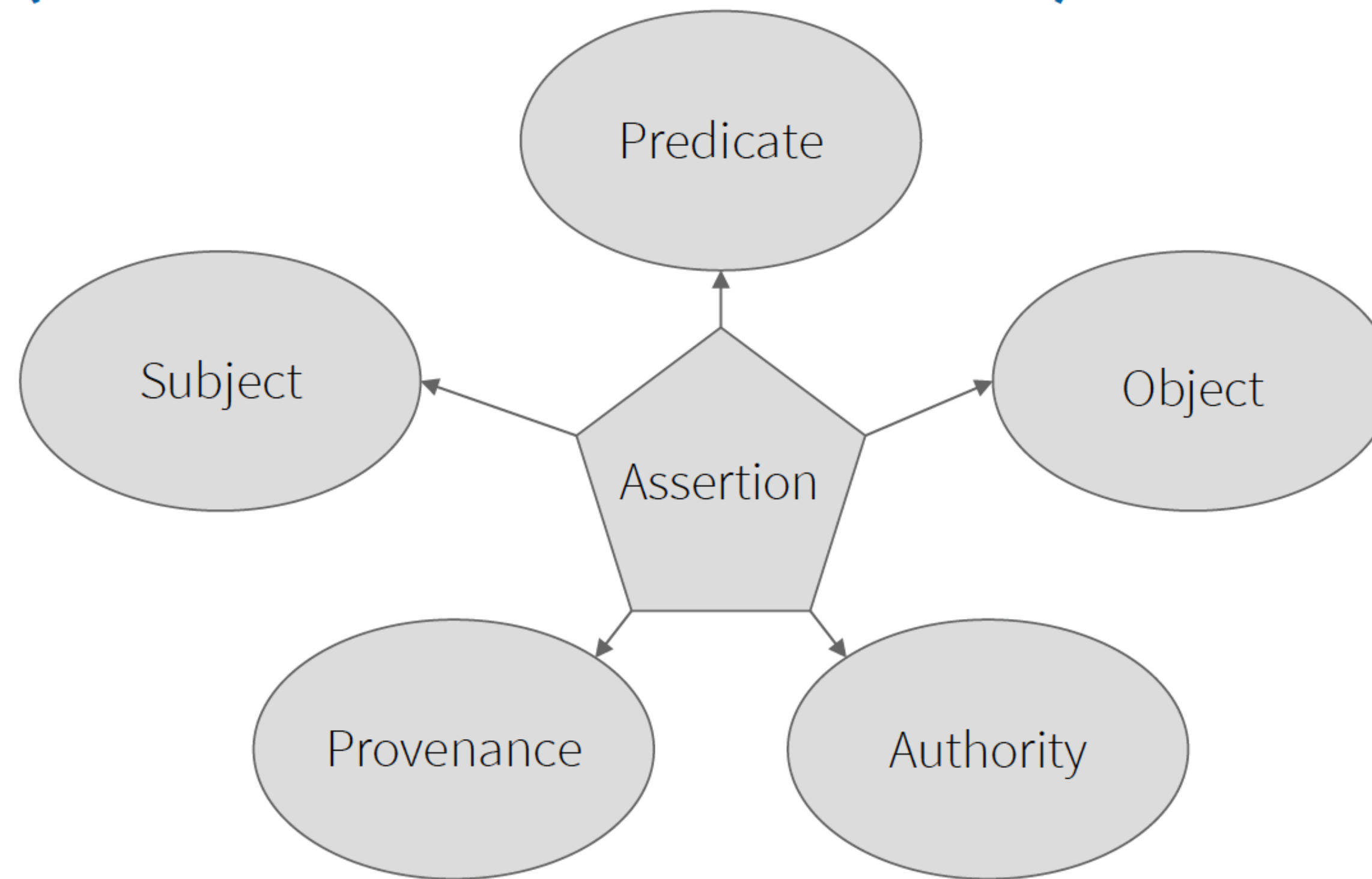

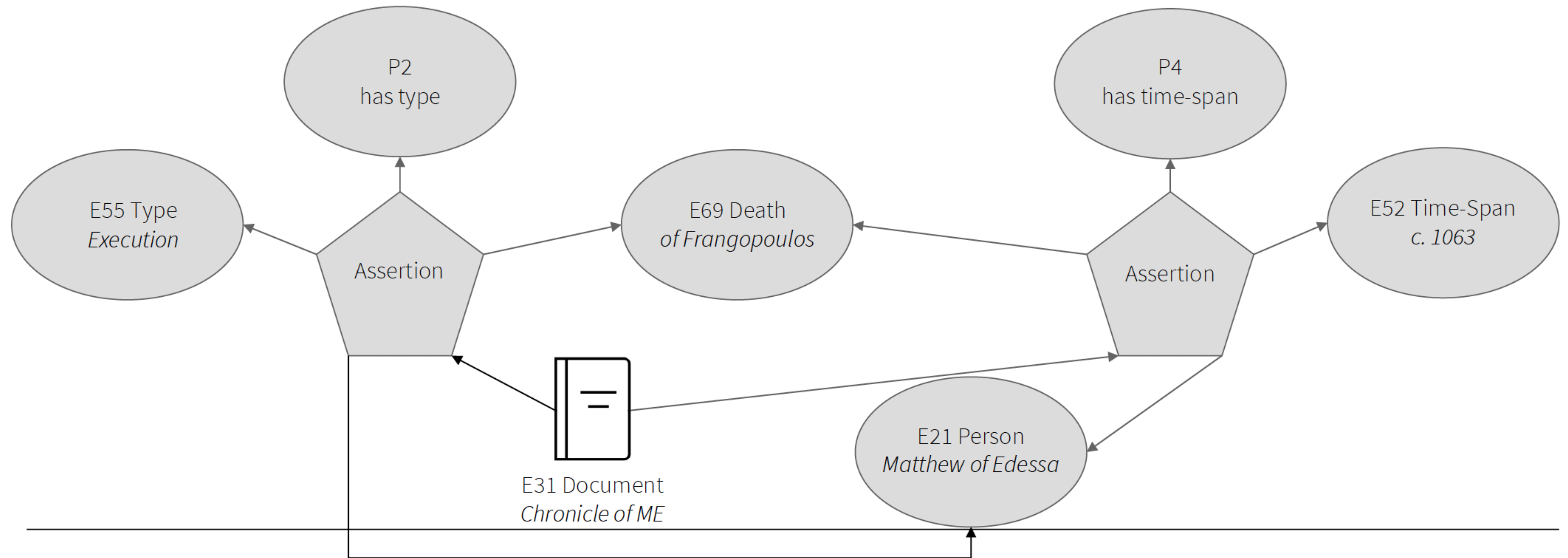

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# Digital History (DHy)

- Research field where you apply IT methodologies, tools, techniques to historical studies, often - although not always - aimed at
  - an automatic or semi-automatic processing of data
  - a quantification of historical data to be analyzed or a visualized
- DHy therefore deals with the **use, study and processing of digital tools applied to historical research**, from the analysis of sources to the dissemination of results.
- It is not a “full” discipline, given that it arises to answer to a whole series of problems and opportunities resulting from the spread of digital technology in historical practice
- DHy is then an updating or a partial modification of a research methodology that already has its big background. But...**this update brings profound changes in the historian's work** and poses new big epistemological problems

## PH - Public History

- late 1960s England; 1970s in North America & Australia as discipline
- growing success, not always with this label, field of action
- the historian not only teaches or disseminates a certain tale of history, but
- applies the methodology to today's problems,
- debates them in the public arena,
- and makes history "in direct contact with the evolution of the mentality and sense of collective belonging of the various communities within the different spaces and in the global world and enhances the study of their identities".







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# From Italian PH Manifesto

- **promotion of** historical knowledge and of the methodologies of historical research among different audiences by a multidisciplinary dialogue;
- practices and experiences focused on the active involvement of groups and communities also in the digital world;
- innovative and good historical researches, achieved thanks also to methodologies and practices of participation;
- definition and sharing of professional and academic good practices of public history and standards for the evaluation of the discipline;



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# From Italian PH Manifesto

- growth and training of public historians who operate outside academic environments with professional skills in research, teach and communicate history;
- development of public history as a new area of research and education;
- contrasting the "abuses of history", or the practices of mystification of the past aimed at manipulating public opinion;
- enhancement of the country's historical, cultural, material and intangible heritage, in all its forms;
- historical research conceived as necessary for solving the problems of the present



---

# From Italian PH Manifesto

- The growth of a full citizenship passes through a more widespread knowledge of the past that allows the overcoming of prejudices and fears multiplying in the contemporary world.
- PH offers opportunities and tools for a critical understanding of historical contexts, helping to face their complexity and avoiding solutions dictated by resentments or alleged "identity" conflicts.
- PH is a valuable resource for social cohesion by promoting understanding and meeting between people of different origins, generations and with conflicting memories.
- PH promotes economic development in strategic sectors, in particular in the field of industry and cultural tourism, working for the protection and enhancement of our extraordinary cultural heritage.
- Public historians can be also consultants in the administrative and legislative sphere and for the resolution of specific problems in the public and private sphere, such as, for example, those relating to the government of the territory or in legal disputes involving local communities



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# PH & Web

There is nothing necessarily “digital” in the concept of PH, BUT the PH makes use of multiple media supports to involve the public and interconnected audiences in the practice of history

- the Web is an unavoidable meta-medium for the diffusion of historical knowledge
- social networks, sites, tools and apps are changing the relationship with the past through the preponderance of individual and collective memories.
- In the real / virtual conflict between history and memory, the public historian offers himself as help in reconstructing the meaning, a remediation agent of knowledge who acts in multiple environments, by building an accessible historiography, by creating community sources, by creating material and immaterial sites that increase awareness of history in the public arena.



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# DHy & DPHy

If by DHy we mean the strong mix between History and Computer Science

and by PH, the area of activity that aims at a methodologically correct involvement of the public in the writing of history ALSO through the Internet

THEN

**DPHy is that field of studies and research**

**that tells the history**

**in the digital world with the involvement**

**of the public at different levels**

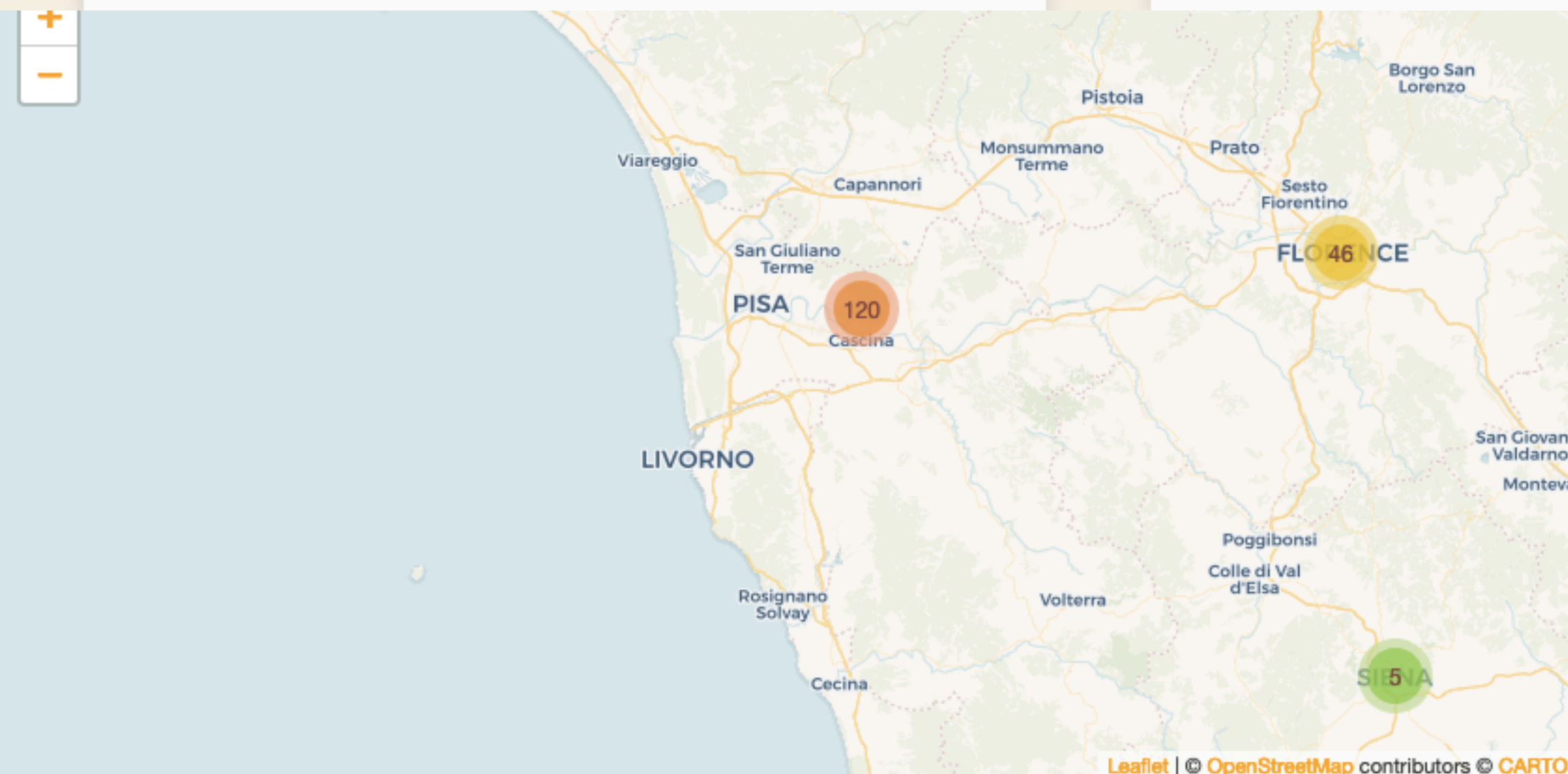

The first bomb to be dropped on Paris in the war fell at exactly 12.45 p.m. The second fell  
minutes later in the courtyard of 107 quai Valmy, a home for the aged and the third landed on  
the pavement outside 66 rue des Marais, not far from the Boulevard Magenta. The final  
explosive crashed through the skylight of 5 and 7 rue des Récollets and failed to explode. All  
the bombs landed within a few hundred metres of each other in the 10th arrondissement of  
Paris, the target probably being, despite the observer's stated concern for public safety, the  
two railway stations which were situated in this district of the capital, and which served,  
significantly, the north and east of France.
